



Come celebrate with us a spectacular mix of music, poetry and art at ID Festival 2022: Shavuot!

The Harvest Fest of Shavuot and the Christian Pentecost fall on the same day this year: June 5. We take the occasion to mark the intercultural exchange between Israel and Germany, and herewith cordially invite you to celebrate with us the sixth edition of ID Festival at Radialsystem, Berlin. This year, it will be a one-day celebration of art, music and poetry get-togethers in the spirit of the Jewish holiday of Shavuot.

Among this year's highlights is "Kreuzberg Sonata": for the first time in Germany, Israeli rock star Eran Zur and a line-up of musical guests - all major figures in the Israeli music scene - will offer an exclusively-for-ID-Festival produced mix of poetry, rock, indie folk, Tolstoy's Kreutzer Sonata and classical modernism.

The festivities will then continue in the "FRAMED @ ID Festival" Kultursalon. Nearly a century after the last Jewish Kultursalon in Berlin took place, our festival visitors will be able to experience a Kultursalon again, Tel-Aviv-Berlin-Style, and enjoy musical performances by the most sought-after alternative jazz-funk acts of the bubbling Tel Aviv music scene. In an informal setting, the event will also comprise the sampling of traditional Shavuot delicacies, as well as an exhibition and a live-painting performance.

Shavuot occurs on the sixth day of the Hebrew month of Sivan. According to the Bible, on that day, the Torah was revealed to Moses and the Israelites at Mount Sinai. Thus, the holiday represents the (trans)formation of a nation, with the epic receipt of the Ten Commandments. Transformation is at the heart of our festival's explorations this year, and our MIFGASHIM (Hebrew for "Encounters") series aims to highlight this aspect of Shavuot:

Dr. Dory Manor and Eran Zur will explore the translation process between poetry and music; Mati Shemoelof will introduce the visionary power of multilingual writing. Photographer Benyamin Reich will argue that forbidden sexual liaisons - such as described in the Book of Ruth, which is traditionally read on Shavuot - are catalysts for great transformations.

Shavuot is also one of the biblically ordained three pilgrimage festivals. In the post-Temple era, there are no longer specific laws on Shavuot, only the tradition of eating dairy foods and "being in a state of joy". ID Festival has both traditions aimed at.

The ID Festival is a platform for the flourishing Israeli cultural scene in Germany. Founded by pianist and composer Ohad Ben-Ari in 2015, the European Festival Award-winning ID Festival fosters collaborations between Israeli artists and local artists and art institutions.
